Review proceedings are governed by the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. Such proceedings are commenced by filing a notice of appeal with the agency clerk of the Office of Insurance Regulation and a copy of the notice, accompanied by any filing fee prescribed by law, with the clerk of the District Court of Appeal where the agency maintains its headquarters or otherwise provided by law. The notice of appeal must be filed within 30 days of the rendition of this order.
